



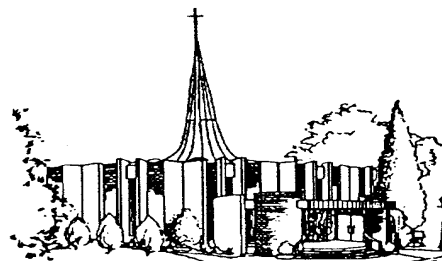

Important Notice - If you want Out of School Care at St Nicholas read on... The Catholic Education Office is conducting a feasibility study into the establishment of Catholic Out of School Hours Care (COSHC) services at a number of parish primary schools, including St Nicholas of Myra Primary Penrith.

Establishment of a COSHC service at the school is subject to a number of factors, including:

- A survey of the parish community to verify demand for the service;
- Existing premises being suitable; and
- The necessary regulatory approvals, including development approval if required.

We expect that fees will be affordable and comparable to other local services, mindful that the centre needs to be financially viable and sustainable.

Families are asked to contribute to a survey of their child care needs in 2012, 2013 and beyond.

Feast Day of the Week

Tue Jun 21 St Aloysius Gonzaga 1568-1591

St. Aloysius Gonzaga was born into a noble family in Lombardy, Italy. His father was a compulsive gambler who wanted Aloysius to grow up to be a war hero. From the age of four he was trained as a soldier and a courtier. When he was twelve, he received his First Communion from St Charles Borromeo. At about age 13, he made a resolution to become a Jesuit. Aloysius prevailed and won a four year contest with his father and was allowed to enter the seminary. Four more years were passed studying philosophy with St Robert Bellarmine as his spiritual advisor. Plague struck Rome in 1591. During the plague, St Aloysius worked in the Jesuit hospital nursing the infected. It wasn't long before he himself became sick. Although he remained in a weakened state, his prayer life remained strong. Aloysius died on June 21, 1591 aged 23.

Fri Jun 24 Birth of John the Baptist

St Augustine commented: 'The Church observes the birth of John the Baptist as in some way sacred. John, it seems, has been inserted as a kind of boundary between the two Testaments, the Old and the New. That he is somehow or other a boundary is something that the Lord himself indicates when he says, "The Law and the prophets were proclaimed until John."' (Luke 16:16)

'So he represents the old and heralds the new. Because he represents the old, he is born of an elderly couple; because he represents the new, he is revealed as a prophet in his mother's womb. You will remember that, before he was born, at Mary's arrival he leapt in his mother's womb. Already he had been marked out there, designated before he was born; it was already shown whose forerunner he would be, even before he saw him.'

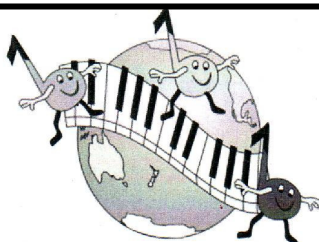

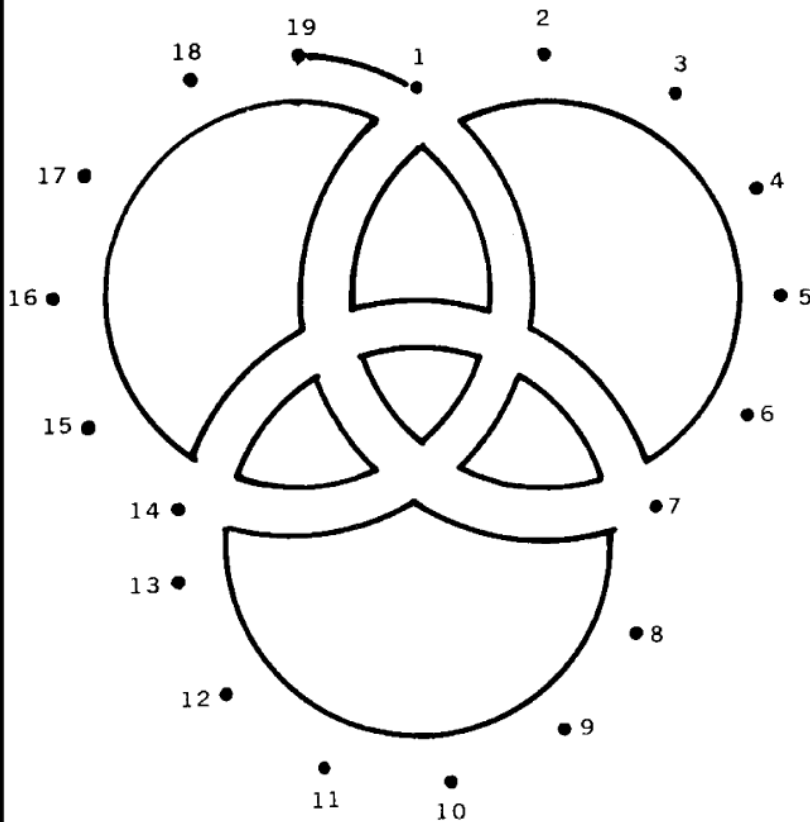
